A Note From Your Facilities Team

The Facilities Team recently met with Phillip from Virginia Garden to firm up plans to re-landscape the grounds of Peakland Baptist Church. We have attached surveyor's tape to many of the bushes, shrubs, and trees that will be removed. As you recall, this work is planned in response to the Lynchburg Police Department's Security survey of our facility. The LPD recommended removing many of the bushes that are so large that they provide excellent hiding places for individuals seeking to vandalize or gain unauthorized entry to our church. The landscape changes we plan to make are summarized below.

1. The large boxwoods along the left side of the sidewalk entrance to the sanctuary will be removed. These provide excellent hiding places, preventing the LPD from conducting effective night-time surveys. The bushes will be replaced with grass.

2. The large boxwoods at the Brooks Center will be removed as well. The Pachysandra ground cover will be removed as well. This area includes the Memorial Scatter garden. A Scatter Garden area will be re-established near the window to the left of the door. We plan decorative, lowmaintenance plantings such as perennial bulbs and azaleas.

3. The over-grown Golden Mop and Nandina plantings on the parking lot side of the Sanctuary will be removed and replaced with very compact Hollies.

4.The boxwoods around the traffic circle will be thinned by removing every other bush. In addition, the remaining boxwoods will be heavily pruned. The result will be ugly boxwoods for several years, but we are assured that they will fill back in within a few years.

5. The large Cedar at the corner of the parking lot will be removed since it is diseased.

6. The smaller evergreen above the back parking lot is dead / dying, and will be removed as well.

7. The holly hedge at the end of the Educational Annex building will be removed.

^aFoundation boxwoods at the Educational Annex will be thinned by removing every other one, and the remaining boxwoods will be extensively pruned.

Other Security upgrades to the building include replacement of the switched outside lighting fixtures with dusk-to-dawn LED lighting fixtures, as well as a camera system to monitor the outside of the building and parking lots. We have already replaced most of the parking lot lights with LED lights to reduce energy consumption, improve the lighting quality, and increase life expectancy.
