# Looking Ahead with Peakland

During the past four years we've worked toward the next chapter in Peakland's story by several means, three of which include:

1) Cottage Meetings with discussion focused on youth and children's ministry viability.

2) Family Focus Events aimed at replacing some of the lost elements from conventional youth and children's ministry.

3) V.I.E.W (Vision, Inspiration, Education, and Worship) Team's year-long assessment of present realities and bright spots.

All of these assessments and experiences leave us now at a point where many realize Peakland's future depends in part on things we've been doing all along, as well as sustained connections we haven't yet been able to realize.

I introduced the following proposal to those in attendance at the Souper Bowl of Caring luncheon on February 5<sup>th</sup>. I believe the energy so many of our individual congregants seek, as well as the way forward for Peakland as a whole, is through **forming consistent ministries with a handful of mission organizations in our community**. One path would require reallocating local mission dollars to four or five such mission organizations that demonstrate Peakland's ministry priorities. Doing so could provide at least four key benefits to assist Peakland in defining its future:

1) Identify the ministry priorities of Peakland's congregation.

2) Provide continual service opportunities for individuals and groups within Peakland's congregation.

3) Identify Peakland as a serious investor to select local mission organizations, and the Greater Lynchburg community by offering significant dollars and regular presence.

4) Provide the best public relations possible by showing our community what Church does.

If my proposal doesn't turn out to be the best option for directing Peakland's future energies, perhaps the conversations around this proposal will lead the congregation to discover the best path forward.

Welcome Bible scholar, teacher, and author Pete Enns, our latest McNeely Lecturer, who will be in town March 25-26.



Dr. Peter Enns (PhD, Harvard University) is Abram S. Clemens professor of Biblical Studies at Eastern University, St. Davids, PA. He has taught courses at several other institutions including Harvard University, Fuller Theological Seminary, and Princeton Theological Seminary. His most recent books have been the subject of several of our reading groups: *The Bible Tells Me So: Why Defending Scripture Has Made Us Unable to Read It* and *The Sin of Certainty: Why God Desires Our Trust More Than Our Correct Beliefs*.

We have scheduled an informal brunch conversation at Acorn Hill Lodge at 11 a.m., Saturday, March 25th. Mr. Enns will be delivering the Shumate lecture, "The Sin of Certainty," at 7:30 that evening at the Lynchburg College Chapel.

He will meet with our adult Sunday School classes on Sunday morning, March 26, and preach in the 11 AM service.
