The people who are actually here already, over potential people who might be here;

Good theology, and finding our sense of identity inside of our agreed upon theology;

A workable and realistic plan of action, including a generous timeline for our goals;

The occasional opportunities to include chocolate in whatever we are doing.

I am deeply honored to be your pastor, and proud to be part of the church at Peakland. I have been very grateful to Donna Johnson, who has connected me to so many things here at the church, and to Debbie Burton and Allen Heer for their shared leadership in worship. I am sorry to miss working with Judi Handel, but appreciate her help in helping us train Kimberly Morales, and look forward to working with Kimberly. And I am enormously indebted to the people on the search committee and to the rest of you who made our coming here possible. I will be so proud to have "Peakland Baptist Church" on my nametag as I represent you at the Alliance of Baptist's gathering this week in Ohio. Several of you have described Peakland as a "hidden gem" to me. Part of my job, as I see it, is to remove the "hidden" part of that, and to help people to know what an amazing church you are! God be with you this week as you continue clean-ups! Keep in touch if we can do anything for you around here!
