August—Mission Models To Consider

During the month of August, our Missions Team is going to share some information for you to consider as we prepare for the fall. There are several models for doing missions in churches, five of which are those most commonly used:

- Giving to Not-for-Profits—church is primarily focused on giving to outside, existing Not-for-Profit organizations; little emphasis is given to volunteering;
- Giving for the Direct Missions of the Church—church gives for a single, specific mission, run by the church itself; great emphasis is given to an active mission of the church;
- Giving with a Seasonal Focus of Volunteerism—church gives broadly, but volunteer efforts are focused on one specific mission for each month or season;
- Giving to Many; Focused on One—church gives broadly, but volunteer efforts are focused on one mission (one Not-for-Profit or denominational organization) or one mission area (hunger, housing, race relations, etc);
- Team Approach—both giving and volunteer efforts are divided into teams (Hunger Team, Homelessness Team, Education Team, etc.)

During this month, the Missions Team will be connecting you with more information about each model, including samples, and will be preparing to hear from you in September about which model of missions appeals to you (corporately).
