



Moving Forward!

What an amazing congregational meeting that was! Your care for this church, your desire to do things that matter in the world, and to find ways to do them together was palpable in the room. I came away with two key points of feedback from you about our missions program:

You would like to work together. You do not want to individualize, or even divide into teams to do our missions.

You would like to have a focus. That focus might change over the course of the year (the Seasonal model, where we focus together on specific issues by season) or it might be a constant, central focus of this church (the Focus on One model), or some variant of those, but you would like for our missions to be focused enough to have an impact on the city (and local missions are key).

How exciting! Now what? So now, we will try to do that. Your missions team is going to offer some events through the fall and winter which give larger groups a chance to be part of mission projects. They won't vary too widely, but they will give us a chance to work with different not-for-profit organizations and to experiment with projects so that we can see what might really call to us. Because we spent a fair amount of time (good time, but a great part of the time allotted to us) on missions, we did not get to really explore what else might be out there thoroughly. We got EXCELLENT response for teams who will be working on our Ground Floor Renovation, our Diaconate, and our By-Laws. You can still join those groups by emailing Donna (peaklandbaptistchurch@verizon.net)—she will pass your name along to leadership. There are also these opportunities:

Worship Team—plan worship themes through the year; help us plan different types of worship and worship events, as well as the look of our sanctuary (decorations, flowers, etc.)—the team would meet seasonally to plan for the next season—doesn't that sound fun?

Fellowship (Hospitality)—plan church-wide events; care for the hospitality of our building—how do we welcome people?

Outreach (Messaging)—what are we telling the world about ourselves? How do we wish to respond to the events around us? What words are our key phrases to describe PBC to others?

Denominational Relations—with whom do we associate? Who will receive money from us for global mission work or peace work in the world? How will we relate to others here in the city? What associations do we wish to have?

Finance—the stewardship of our money is important work—how do we allocate our funds? How do we plan for the future of the church? How do we have an impact on the issues we care about? How do we care for our staff and our building?

As you can see, there are lots of good things to do! Continue to think prayerfully about what you would like to be doing and let us know!
