



Emmanuel

We have heard this word all of our lives, especially those of us who have grown up in church. *Emmanuel*. Many of us know its meaning: it is a Hebrew word (, (שמנואל) which means "God is with us" or "God with us." The Hebrew word, el or אָל, mean might, strength, good, power, heroes, mighty things in nature, or god, or God, https://www.blueletterbible.org/lang/ lexicon/lexicon.cfm?strongs=H410&t=KJV. So the word, although used exclusively for Jesus, could also mean "strength with us," "power with us," "good with us." Like the passage in Romans 8 read in worship on November 25 (Romans 8:31-39), this word would indicate that as we go about our daily lives, we are accompanied by great strength, a powerful ally, a mighty hero, working for good and in our corner. What an amazing word with which to approach the season—what a great thought: "If God is for us, who can be against us?" The way most of us live our lives, we go along, perhaps for years at a time, feeling fine and in control. We don't really have a sense that we need God working for our good, because we believe that we are able to do so—that we are in control of how well our lives are going. And then, suddenly, we are not in control. Each of us has our own experience, but observably, if we live long enough, something enters our lives which throws us off balance, and over which we have no control whatsoever. And so we draw comfort from a season which reminds us that we have an Emmanuel—God with us. Over the next few weeks, we invite you to enjoy the submissions to our advent book, which is a collection of stories from people in our congregation who have told of a person, in their lives, who embodied the love of God for them. We invite you to join us for worship, during which we will explore the advent themes of Hope, Peace, Joy and Love. We invite you to join us for our Open House at the parsonage on Dec. 2 from 4pm-6pm, and then to come on Dec. 5 at 6pm for our Congregational Dinner and Quarterly Meeting (which, I am assured, is a lot more fun than it sounds). We invite you to join us for our Christmas Eve service at 5pm on Dec. 24th, a special, family-focused service. And we invite you to enjoy your celebrations with family and friends, knowing that the God who created the universe and continually works for its good, is with you, and in your corner.

State of our 2018 Finances

As we have concluded the third quarter of 2018, the Stewardship Team is reporting to our congregation the financial results for the 9 months ended September 30, 2018 as compared to last year for the same period and to our second quarter budget:

Our expenses are close to budget. Our revenue is currently over our expectations primarily because a number of members have accelerated payment of their pledges into the first part of the year. Investments have increased by \$27,358 as the market was better in the third quarter. Our total cash and investments are just over \$1,144,000 of which, \$885,000 are unrestricted. As always, we will have a complete financial report at our next congregational meeting. If you would like more information prior to that meeting, you may obtain detailed financial statements from the church office or contact me with questions.
