



Epiphany

Eureka! said Archimedes. "I have found it!" Great story—triumph of scientific thought and intellect. "I figured it out!" We use "epiphany" the same way in English—a little light bulb goes on over our heads. We figured it out! The Greek word, *epiphaino*, means to "appear," "give light," in the active voice, or to "appear," or "be revealed," in the passive. Traditionally, the Feast of the Holy Theophany, or Epiphany, of our Lord celebrates the baptism of Jesus by John, at which he is revealed-or, "outed," if we want to use modern vernacular, as the embodiment of the Holy Spirit of God. It is a foundational moment in our theology of the Trinity: Father, Son and Holy Spirit. I find it to be a beautiful holiday, though one that is different in character from Christmas. At Christmas, everything is lit by candles—soft light in the darkness, a comforting, celebratory atmosphere. To me, Epiphany is more like the morning after the New Year's Eve party—it is the moment when the lights come on, and all the leftovers from the party are revealed: the empty cups, the potato chip crumbs, the half-eaten cookies. It isn't a bad thing. It's just that the beautiful story-like elements of Christmas are past, and we are returned to our realities. Our realities are that we have to pay those credit card bills, that we must return to work or school, that the dryer won't fix itself and the tires on that car aren't going to last the winter. Our realities include our losses and our griefs, our accomplishments and our failures. But the story of Christmas is not that a baby was born once, and then the event was over. The story of Christmas is that when this child was born, the Earth was forever changed. We take Christmas with us into our realities. Unlike Narnia, where, for a time, it was always winter and never Christmas, the truth revealed to us at Epiphany is that it is always Christmas. God broke through reality to bring us out of our darkness and this person, Jesus of Nazareth, is the manifestation of God's presence with us. We may have to clean up periodically, but we are still at the party, still invited to the table. Epiphany may be LED lights to Christmas' candles, but it is light nonetheless. I wish you joy in your New Year—may the light of this season break through into your reality with the love of God!

Sound in the Sanctuary

- Continued to connect with the needs of congregation through our prayer team, and through the ministries of men and women in the church who pray, who visit, who call, who bring casseroles, and who care deeply for each other.

I could not have, in my wildest dreams, pictured that we would accomplish so much in this time. I believe (now you all know what a big deal it is for me to use that word) that God has been at work in us and through us, and will continue to do so. May God continue to bless us richly in 2019!
