



Entering the Wilderness

As we move out of February and into March, we also move out of the season of Epiphany and into the season of Lent. Many of us did not grow up learning about Lent—all I knew about it for many years was that you were supposed to give something up. After years of trying that as a spiritual practice, I found that all that happened when I gave up chocolate or (heaven forbid) coffee was that I spent a lot of time missing the thing I had given up. These days, I like to add a practice of spiritual discipline rather than give something up. There are many opportunities for this: walking with our walking group on Thursdays, using the labyrinth at Randolph College, coming to the Bible study on Wednesdays, attending the Lenten services at Court Street UMC on Wednesdays (more on this later), meditating, praying more, even fasting as a spiritual discipline. Lent is an inward season, intended as a time of personal reflection. During this season, we'll be exploring the theme of journeying through the wilderness through our biblical stories in worship: the people of Israel journeying through the desert; the stories of Esther, Job, Gideon and Sampson; the temptation and wilderness experiences of Jesus. As you approach your practice of Lent, I will be praying for each of you that it is a fruitful and meaningful time.

March 21st is **World Down Syndrome Day!** In honor of that day, we invite all PBC people to wear your **most fun socks** to worship on March 17th! We will take a moment in worship to recognize the way Jesus reached out to people with disabilities (the way he did with women and children and others on the outside of society) and brought them in as equals. Don't forget your fun socks on the 17th!

As you may be aware, a new organization in town, **Food for Thought** (in partnership with all the good ministries at Parkview) began last fall to try and make sure that every child in Lynchburg schools is able to go home with food for the weekend if they need it. Since September, we've been working with E C Glass to find what will work on the high school level—a bit more complicated than the elementary level. During February, we decided to set up both high schools as "markets" rather than backpack rooms with pre-packed bags. With some discretionary funds from our missions budget, I purchased some very nice tubs to keep foods safe in the ECG closet, and bought some items to have on hand: good cereals, individual mac and cheese and meal packets—many things that can be made in a microwave oven. This past Friday, we opened the market for the first time from 7:00am-7:30am. The administrator for ECG had sent out an announcement, and also stood in the hallway inviting students in. Several said, "Well, we don't have any money." When we said, "No, it's all free," you should have seen their faces. Their eyes got wide and they came in and shopped around, each getting only a few things, but happily searching for the thing that they wanted. We are off to a GREAT start with the market, and I look forward to hearing from any of you who would like to be part of making it work at ECG. Go Hilltoppers!
