



sacred Conversations

Over the last several months, our Congregational Council, as well as those working on by-laws and on diaconate structure, have had wonderful conversations about our church. We've talked about our systems and what has worked in the past and what has not. We've been listening to each other respectfully and talking about how we could facilitate a church culture where everyone feels "safe, loved, and heard," as our young guest last Sunday, Sarah Courtney, described it. Recently, we have realized that the time has come to bring those conversations to the whole congregation, inviting everyone into the discussions of our systems and our agreements and working to make sure everyone has a chance to be heard. In service of this goal, we have planned to alter our summer worship schedule to include space for those "sacred conversations."

At our May 19th meeting, we agreed to the following schedule:

Beginning June 9th and ending on July 28th, we will have an abbreviated schedule in worship, with only two hymns, one piece of special music and a shortened homily, working to complete formal worship in 40 minutes. Then, using our "Passing of the Peace" as a transition time, we will invite everyone who wants to do so to move forward and sit closer together, and we will spend the last 15-20 minutes inviting conversation about the topic of that day's worship—or other topics that might be important to those in the room. This time for conversation allows us eight Sundays during which we can discuss elements of how we engage with each other and how we each experience safety, what makes each of us feel loved.
