



# Sacred Conversations

Thank you to all of you who participated in the Sacred Conversations we had in the sanctuary this summer. Your leadership valued, so highly, hearing your voices, hearing your love for this church and each other, and even hearing some of your concerns. We also heard some concerns, as well as a bit of confusion, about the process we chose through which to have these conversations. What we hoped to be solving for was:

- 1. Finding a time when the majority of the church community could be together;
- 2. Exploring ways to bring God's presence into the conversations we are needing to have about our church community, including the idea of a covenant between us.

Following some feedback that expressed some of this confusion, your leadership decided to finish four of the conversations in the sanctuary, and then find different ways to complete the conversations. We voted to offer a conversation on August 25<sup>th</sup> (the last Sunday in August) during the Sunday School hour, offering breakfast (pancakes, bacon, waffles—the whole nine yards) and time for small group discussion.

Working on a covenant is something that may take us some time, and we plan to take all the time we need.

Here at PBC we are always looking for ways to help in our community. We have decided to start a *"Pull for the House"* initiative! We will have a few containers set up around the church to collect aluminum pull tabs. We will be sending them to the Charlottesville Ronald McDonald House.

About Ronald McDonald House:

When a child becomes critically ill, the first concern is always for the child's well-being. Seeking medical treatment is primary. Secondly, the family must have a place to live while the child is hospitalized or receiving out-patient treatments. Before Ronald McDonald House, out-of-town families had to endure the discomfort of sleeping in the hospital or take on the incredible expense and isolation of staying in a hotel. Ronald McDonald House offers families:

- \* A comfortable private bedroom and bathroom
- \* Home-cooked meals
- \* Laundry and play rooms
- \* Outdoor play area
- Shared living areas

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- \* Computers with internet access
- \* Ongoing support from staff, volunteers, and other families in similar situations

It's just so simple! Pull tabs are easy to collect and store and are less messy than collecting the entire cans. Not to mention, there is more concentrated aluminum in Pull Tabs than in the cans, so they are able to get more money for something a lot smaller. The local recycling center will weigh the collected tabs and cut a check to Ronald McDonald.

100% of the money earned is used towards the operating cost of Ronald McDonald House and to provide the families with their needs. You can easily see that the little pull tab you used to throw away is very valuable to the guest families at the House.

Look for the collection containers around the church. Thank you for your support!
