



# New Spiritual Formation Offerings

Spiritual Formations is just the latest term for the pursuit of growth in our life of faith. It includes acquiring new knowledge, experiencing God in our lives, and using practices that deepen our faith. In service of spiritual growth, we have a few new offerings for this year.

**Baptism:** On Sunday, September 8th, during the Sunday School hour, we will meet in the Fellowship Hall to talk about what we mean, here at Peakland Baptist, who we invite to be baptized. What are we, as a church, sharing in offering to baptism? What are we asking individuals to say when they are baptized. This class is open to anyone, you don't have to be seeking baptism to join us.

**Bible Basics:** This is a once-a-month class, offered during the Sunday School Hour (9:45-10:45). This class is open to all ages, and will focus on gaining Bible knowledge, learning the Bible books, and what each one means in terms of interpreting those books. We will play games, have Bible drills and enjoy breakfast snacks together on the following dates: 9/29, 10/27, 11/24, 1/26, 2/23, 3/29, 4/26, 5/24

**Open Sanctuary Quiet Hours:** Wednesday mornings, from 7:00am to 9:30am our pastor will be present in the sanctuary to offer quiet hours. Reading materials will be available, and the sanctuary will be open for anyone who would like to come and sit quietly. The sanctuary will also be open during the week when church staff is in the building (9 am—2 pm weekdays) for anyone who would like to come sit quietly and pray, or read, or meditate.

**Women's Dialogue Group:** We are currently looking for any women who might be interested in a monthly gathering to discuss a variety of issues. Topics will include (but are not limited to) Personality and identity, using the Enneagram personality scale and other tools to aid discussion; Gender roles; Partnering and Parenting; Living out our faith. Chocolate will be made available at each meeting, as will childcare, as requested. If you are interested, please let Martha Kearse know; once we have the names of those interested, we will work to find a time that works for as many as possible.

Our **Wednesday morning Bible Study, which meets at 10 am on Wednesdays,** will continue, beginning on September 4th. In addition, our **Craft Group**, will continue on Tuesdays at 2 pm, beginning on September 3rd. We would like to keep our **Walking Group** going as well, currently meeting at 9 am on Thursdays. And our wonderful Sunday School classes, **Formations, Searchers, and The Forum,** are available to everyone each week.

#### SEARCHERS CLASS September, 2019

September will find the Searchers class completing its study of *The Good Book*, a compilation of writings about Bible passages by well-known authors. We will then have discussions on Gilgamesh, the oldest piece of epic world literature. We will be using the translation by Stephen Miller.

Gilgamesh was found when scholars were looking for physical evidence to corroborate events described in the Bible. What they found was that the Bible drew upon much older Sumerian myths. Gilgamesh's quest for, and questions about, the meaning of life in the face of death will make for interesting conversations!

The final session in September will be reflections on a portion of a memoir by mystery writer Nevada Barr.







#### State of our 2019 Finances

As we have concluded the second quarter of 2019, the Stewardship Team is reporting to our congregation the financial results for the 6 months ended June 30, 2019 as compared to last year for the same period and to our second quarter budget:

Our expenses are close to budget. Our revenue is currently over our expectations primarily because a number of members have accelerated payment of their pledges into the first half of the year. Investments have only increased by \$112,066 as the market was good through June. Our total cash and investments are just over \$1,143,000 of which, \$878,000 are unrestricted.

As always, we will have a complete financial report at our next congregational meeting. If you would like more information prior to that meeting, you may obtain detailed financial statements from the church office or contact me with questions.
