McNeely Room

As we begin offering programing in our McNeely Room, we want to invite anyone in our congregation to feel free to schedule the use of the room. We will be working on official policies in the next few months, but as we have talked about the use of this room, the general idea has been this:

Any person who is a member or a consistent participant at PBC may schedule the use of the room. That person will be responsible for opening the room, setting up, care of the room while it is in use, cleaning up and removing garbage if food has been served. Scheduling is done through the church office with Nicole Zulauf and <u>must be confirmed</u> (i.e. leaving a message on the phone is not enough—Nicole must contact you with confirmation).

We will be offering some "open hours," sponsored by the church. Whenever the room is open, anyone can come and make use of the room. When we have open hours, the church will require a host be present the entire time—that is, a church member or consistent participant who takes responsibility for the care of the room (i.e., no one is breaking things) and for the care of the people in the room (i.e., prepared to call 911 if necessary). We will be in the process of looking for hosts and training hosts this winter.

The room may not be used for "For Profit" ventures, but it is possible that the church could work with members and consistent participants who may want to offer a class at which attendees would reimburse them for their time and talent, for example an art class or a yoga class.

All these policies are pending approval and affirmation of Congregational Council and congregation, but hopefully this gives a good general idea of where we have been talking about going with this room.

Directory 2020

We've spent some time, this year, finding out who would like to be identified as a member here at Peakland and preparing to create a new directory that will better serve our needs. The Congregational Council has decided that this directory will be <u>made in-house</u>, and that it will be <u>formatted to offer each family one page</u>, <u>front and back</u>, <u>for pictures and information</u>, to go in a three-ring binder. In January, we will be sending out the template for the information for each family page. For right now, we are ready to begin <u>receiving digital pictures of your family</u>. Pictures should be sent as JPG files, and should be pictures of:

Family members, where each family member's face is clearly visible and identifiable

Extended family (perhaps, adult children or relations who are former members and still connected to Peakland Baptist)

Family enjoying activities or hobbies
