State of our 2020 Finances

As we have concluded the third quarter of 2020, the Finance Team is reporting to our congregation the financial results for the 9 months ended September 30, 2020 as compared to last year for the same period and our third quarter budget:

Despite services primarily being online during the COVID 19 crisis, we are close to our budget for contributions through nine months of the year. It is important to note that many have accelerated their pledge payments this year. We are hopeful that all will complete their pledges in this critical time.

Our expenses are below budget because we have not yet paid any of our insurance (it's not due until December), and have deferred most capital projects. However, we have funded all of our regular missions (as well as used some special funds to augment our giving to local missions) and kept all employees. We are hopeful that we will end the year within our budget, but it appears that we will have a significant loss for 2020.

The market value of our investments decreased significantly during the first quarter, but have recovered plus some (at least for now). As you know, we do not consider this spendable cash as we know it is our long-term savings and can be very volatile. Our cash and investments total \$1,250,000 with \$960,000 in unrestricted funds.

Our congregation has remained faithful to the church and we are truly grateful! With continued uncertainty ahead, it is imperative that we all continue to remember the church, with our participation, offerings, and prayer. Additionally, it is critical that as we work through our budget process, everyone return their 2021 pledge card so that we can plan for next year.

PBC Budget and Leadership

What does leadership at PBC look like in 2021? We are trying to think that through right now. It is understandable that many in our community feel overwhelmed by the realities of the world right now. As well as having restrictions on gathering and mobility within the community, there are the added tasks that have come with doing our jobs and school and other regular elements of life inside of a pandemic. Our priorities are, always:

Worship and Spiritual Formation—providing our community with grounded, creative and lovely ways to connect with God and grow in our faith;

Pastoral Care—looking out for each other's needs to the best of our ability;

Facility and Financial Stewardship—using what we have been given carefully and responsibly;

Mission Actions—sharing what we have with the larger community.

As a Baptist church, we have to make decisions about those things together. Many are not controversial—like paying the water bill—and they just need to happen. Others, like setting financial priorities or decisions about employees if our circumstances change, need the input of a Team so that those who have been asked to make those decisions are able to make them and the rest of us see a transparent system that we have all agreed to carry out.

Our Congregational Council meets on November 15th to discuss ideas for 2021. We look forward to the Congregational meeting on December 6th to present our ideas to you!
