At our May meeting, the Congregational Council discussed the mask policy at PBC. As always through this pandemic, our interest is in protecting the most vulnerable in our midst. As the percentage of people in Lynchburg who are vaccinated remains below 50% and we know that children under age 12 cannot yet get the vaccine, the CC voted to continue with a policy of requiring masks during our worship services. Smaller groups who are able to establish that everyone present is vaccinated are free to make masking decisions for their group. We will continue to re-visit our policy and make changes as more information becomes available.

What is it, who serves on it, and why should you care? From Congregational Council Moderator, Kathy Morland Hammitt

Your Congregational Council is made up of church leaders who manage the church in:

- the Spiritual Formation practices of the church;
- the Administration of the work and functions of the church;
- the Messaging of the church, inside the church and with the world;
- the Missions of the church, inside the church and with the world.

In addition to myself as Moderator, your Congregational Council is made up of the following: our Pastor, Martha Kearse; Assistant Moderator Georgeann Snead; Treasurer Amy Ray; Assistant Treasurer Ed Burnette; Church Clerk Becky Howard; and Team leaders: Bonnie Benedict – the Diaconate; Jim Ray – Facilities; Victor Angell – Finance; Linda Williams and Cheryle Angell – Missions; Fran Christie – Personnel; and Susan Epling – Spiritual Formations.

Why care about the Council? We want our church to reflect what you, our membership, want and need. This starts with understanding how decisions are made in our church, who makes decisions, and how your voice can best be heard and ways in which you might want to contribute.

First, let me introduce myself as your 2021 Moderator. I'm Kathy Morland Hammitt, and I've enjoyed being a part of Peakland Baptist Church since its inception. I remember going to Sunday school and church when we met at the old Garland Rhodes school, and my father, Dr. Ken Morland, filled in as an interim minister along with Dr. Fred Rowe – both colleagues at what was then Randolph Macon Woman's College – until the first minister of PBC could be hired. While I've come and gone from Lynchburg and the church over the years, I have always cherished those I grew up with in our church and the older generation that cared for my generation. I live in Lynchburg but work full time for the Sjogren's Foundation, located in the Washington, DC area, as its Vice President of Medical and Scientific Affairs. I was a television news producer in our nation's capital when I was diagnosed with Sjogren's and shifted to what would become a lifelong career in non-profit work as I juggled my chronic, autoimmune disease. My husband Harry and I are grateful to have two adult children and two grandchildren.

I was fortunate last year to be Assistant Moderator to Jackie Asbury, who, as an excellent and experienced leader, initiated me into our church governance. Now, as Moderator, I chair the Congregational Council and, along with Council members, serve as a liaison between church members, service teams and staff and ensure our church functions smoothly through its decision-making processes. As such, we encourage you to express your ideas for and needs from our church community – always in a respectful way, of course! – to our Pastor, myself as Moderator, and/ or the Congregational Council at any time. And we hope you'll join us for upcoming opportunities for interaction as a community and discussions with one another on the second Sunday following an outside service during the summer.

Baptist churches emphasize congregational governance, and that means all of you – our members – are an especially critical part of our processes and ability to function well in service to all of our members and the broader community. State of our 2021 Finances

As we have concluded the first four months of 2021, the Finance Team is reporting to our congregation the financial results for the period ended April 30, 2021, as compared to last year for the same period and our four month budget:

Contributions, and other	April 2020 \$ 83,604	April 2021 Budget \$ 73,410	April 2021 Actual \$103,622
Expenses	95,224	92,910	80,686
Operating (Loss) Income	\$ (11,620)	\$(19,500)	\$ 22,936
Investment Increase (decrease)	\$(169,609)	\$ 0	\$ 36,557

We are well ahead of our budget for the first four months of the year. Many of our congregation have accelerated their pledge payments which is not uncommon for our church. Additionally, our expenses are below budget because we have not yet paid any of our insurance (it's not due until December), nor have we funded any missions yet.

The market value of our investments increased nicely during the first four months of 2021. As you know, we do not consider this spendable cash as our investments are our long-term savings and can be very volatile. Our cash and investments total \$1,440,000 with \$1,100,000 in unrestricted funds.

All of this stands in stark contrast to last year when the Covid-19 Pandemic was beginning to grip our country and the world. Our congregation has remained faithful to the church, and we are truly grateful! As we start to emerge from the Pandemic, it is important that we all continue to remember the church, with our participation, offerings, and prayer.


