# **Reports from Congregational Council**

Your Congregational Council met on 7/18. The following were Action Items approved by the CC:

- Council authorizes \$1000 from the Daughtry Youth Fund be made available for the PBC youth program in August for special activities.
- Council authorizes \$750 to repair and raise the surveillance camera in the PBC parking lot.
- Council authorizes Martha to obtain an administrative assistant not to exceed previous salary from temp agency or other source as needed and until a new position can be defined and filled.

The CC also discussed our progress in our Second Sunday events and small group discussions. There are some proposals on the table for 2022 which will be discussed in our August Small Groups and then brought back to the CC in our September meeting.
