Really, Really Good News

In December of 2021, PBC received a gift from the estate of Margaret Osteen in the amount of \$189,000, a gift we did not expect. Typically, our policy has been that any such gift would go into our endowment fund. Because we've been cast into a very different time over the past two years, the Congregational Council proposed to the congregation that we could, in this instance, vary our policy by allocating the funds differently. At our Congregational Meeting on March 13th, the congregation vote to allocate this gift in the following way:

- 10% (or around \$19000) would be allocated for mission work in our community in partnership with one or more of the organizations with whom we already do mission work;
- 45% (or around \$85000) would go into this year's budget, with each team offering proposals for its use and the opportunity for broad involvement in the conversations about its allocation
- 45% (or around \$85000) would go into the endowment fund.

How can you be part of the decisions about the use of these funds? GLAD YOU ASKED!

- 1. Join a team—Missions, Finance, Fellowship, Facilities, Personnel and Spiritual Formations will all be discussing what proposals they would like to offer for the use of this money. Once teams have made proposals to the Congregational Council, the CC will bring its recommendations to the church.
- 2. Attend the Congregational Meeting when those proposals have been sent to the congregation and share your voice in conversation with us on these decisions.

End of list! No Teams are looking to create a lot of meetings—most of these conversations can take place through email. Let us know in the church office if you would like to add your voice!


