

Message from the Searchers Sunday School Class

Members and Friends of PBC -- This to invite you to consider participating in our "Searchers" book discussion and care group.

The Searchers has existed for many years within PBC as a group of people actively engaged in seeking out, reading and discussing meaningful books on religious beliefs, practices and history. The Searchers group generally meets every Sunday to discuss a selected book -- the group currently meets in the McNeely Room (ground floor of the Brooks Center) prior to the worship service, but is also set up to meet remotely (by Zoom) at need. Discussion books are selected by group member consensus, and are discussed (in segments) over several sessions.

The Searchers is also a designated PBC Care Group, focusing not only on group member needs, but also on the needs of members and friends who might find it difficult to maintain close church affiliation.
