Peakland Connects

Peakland Connects begins this month! This program is designed to bridge the gap between people who are in one of our Care Groups and people who cannot join a Care Group for reasons of health or mobility.

The program works like this: you choose any four weeks out of the 52 weeks from June 1, 2023 through June 30, 2024. Join at any time!

Week One: I will give you 3 PBC names from the list of people who may be dealing with illness/recovery from surgery, who are homebound, or who might be in need of some general encouragement, like our students or those who are looking for jobs.

You will choose how you would like to make contact with those on your list. At the end of the seven days, I will make contact with you for your update. The subsequent three weeks of your choice will work exactly the same way. Our goal will be that, at some point during the year, everyone will receive care from a **Peakland Connects** volunteer and everyone will have had a chance to be a volunteer!

Seven members of the Congregational Council have already agreed to participate. There are <u>no meetings</u>, just one on one contact with me. It is a pleasure to present this opportunity. Say "YES! I want to be part of **Peakland Connects!**"

Our Values Discussions

Beginning last fall, your Congregational Council started talking about how we might find language around the PBC identity—a clear "elevator speech" that would encompass all our values and would constitute a clear foundation for policies and programs going forward. The result was what was shared with you this spring:

Four Baptist Freedoms Hospitality Spiritual Journey

We have had two lunch discussions about these proposed values, the result

of which is a renewed commitment to reading the original PBC Covenant together in worship and the updating of a New Members folder, which helps those who have joined us in the last few years to connect with our policies and understand how we do things here.

Spiritual Journey

During worship services this summer (except for communion Sundays, which will include a hymn sing and a short homily), the sermon time will be focused on those three values, beginning with the Four Baptist Freedoms in June, then Hospitality in July and the Spiritual Journey in August. During the sermon time, we'll define our terms, talk about the language of our values documents and allow space for your comments and questions and thoughts. Hopefully, by August, everyone will have had a chance to participate in these conversations and to feel comfortable with the task of adopting these values. Not only will that help us all to have a clear sense of our identity, but it will help us market our church to others. As Clifton Potter always says, "See you in church!"

<u>Parsonage Update</u>

First, let me say a word of thanks for the opportunity to live in the parsonage these last five years. It is a lovely home, and the hospitality of the church has been wonderful. My decision to buy my own home was one that had to do with my own finances and personal situation.

The Congregational Council met on the subject of the parsonage and is offering two recommendations to the church about its future use:

- 1) That the church should rent the parsonage, using a rental management company to provide upkeep and monitoring of renters;
- 2) That \$10,000 be allocated for repairs to the parsonage:
 - -a leak in an upstairs toilet caused damage to the ceiling of the downstairs bathroom;
 - -paint on the ceilings in the kitchen and bathrooms needs to be redone because of peeling due to the moisture.

Jim Ray estimates that the cost of these repairs will not reach the \$10k allocated, but requested that amount for unexpected expenses.

On June 4th, we will meet briefly after worship to vote on those two proposals. We will stay in the sanctuary for this brief meeting.


Bible Study
